Introduction

Statements conveying a persistently negative image of public organizations have been heard for many years. A first type of criticism presents an image of ill-spirited bureaucrats, constantly trying to figure out how to increase regulation of citizens while extending their own "malign influence" (du Gay 2000, 2), or of the lazy, procrastinating, and indifferent bureaucrat with no customer or service orientation, busy "reading magazines, planning sailing trips or buying and selling stocks" (Osborne and Gaebler 1992, 127). Another criticism concerns the general perception of public organizations as being too big, wasteful, slow, unreliable, not sufficiently transparent, and inefficient (du Gay 2000; Goodsell 2004). Writers have described the traditional model of public administration as old-fashioned, obsolete, "in need of drastic reform" (Hughes 1998, 34) and as "nightmarishly frustrating" for those who are "trapped inside it" (Osborne and Plastrik 1997, 18).

These negative images of government are reflected in and reinforced by writers who point to a general decline in levels of trust in government (Kennedy 2009; Nye, Zelikow, and King 1998; OECD 2000), by criticism of public service motivation (Perry and
